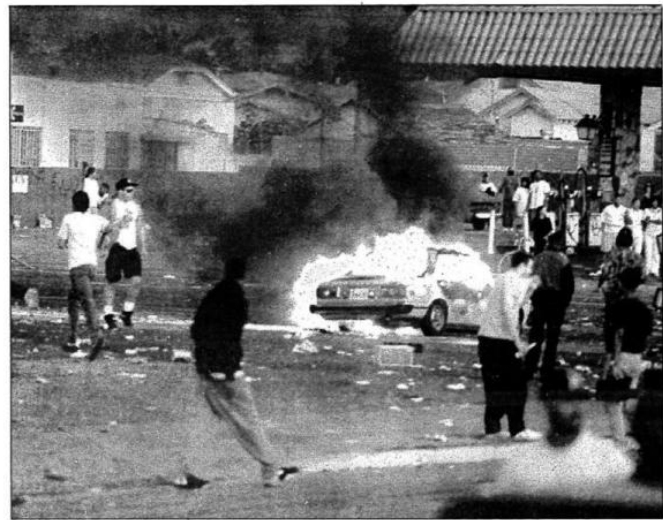

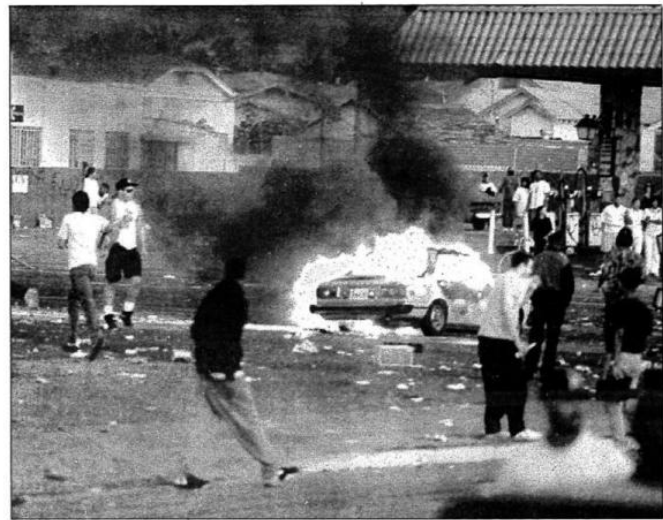

Los Angeles was rocked by widespread rioting, looting and acts of arson night after four white cops were acquitted of nearly all assault charges in the videotaped beating of Rodney King. The black motorist who was subdued under a barrage of police batons.

The verdict was an explosive climax to a year of political uproar and national outrage, and the reaction to it prompted Los Angeles Mayor Tom Bradley to declare a state of emergency and request assistance from the National Guard as chaos spread from the city's most black south side to the Downtown Civic Center area.

At least one person was dead and 72 injured, the Associated Press reported.

In one of many outbreaks of rage, looters ran wild and police headquarters were besieged by chaotic crowds throwing rocks and flares.

Police were ordered to steer clear of some blocks for fear their presence would stoke further violence. Paramedics reportedly held back for fear for their own safety.

Inner-city hospital emergency rooms were reportedly clogged with injured, including people with gunshot wounds.

Daniel Freeman Memorial Hospital admitted 20 people to the emergency room, with injuries ranging from minor to critical, said spokeswoman Mary Schnack.

The violence started in largely black South Central Los Angeles, then spread later to downtown in the area of City Hall. Overturned police cars were in flames across the street from City Hall.

Blacks, whites and Hispanics joined the roving bands, TV news reports said.

emergency and requested help from California Gov. Pete Wilson, who agreed to send in 2,000 National Guard troops.

"We regret this violence is escalating," Jesse Jackson told ABC television's "Nightline." "We shall do all we can do to discourage it."

A thousand people demonstrated outside the Los Angeles Police Department's Parker Center headquarters downtown. They stomped on cars, set banners on fire and tried to storm the building.

Can't keep up "We don't have the personnel to keep up with what's happening," Los Angeles police spokesman Sharyn Michelson told CNN. "There's so many fires going on right now, so much damage, we

can't stop to get an estimate," Michelson said the department was calling off-duty cops in to work.

In a scene broadcast live on television, a truck driver was pulled from his tractor-trailer rig, beaten and clubbed with a fire iron. Nearby, looters went through a liquor store, gas station and auto parts store.

Men who beat the truck driver raised their hands and smiled.

In another attack, about 25 people stood around as looters pulled a man from a vehicle at the intersection, beat and kicked him.

A man in a white truck had his window smashed and was pulled out of the cab and beaten.

A motorcyclist was seen firing a shotgun at passing cars at the intersection.
