Saeko Suzuki worked at the East Asia Library (EAL) as Tateuchi Cataloger for Japanese Retrospective Conversion from January 2010 to September 2014, a position funded by the Atsuhiko and Ina Goodwin Tateuchi Foundation. Her work involved cataloging EAL's backlog of previously un-cataloged Japanese materials, including a number of rare materials such as the Bukan Collection (registries of Japanese feudal lords published during the Tokugawa period [1603-1868]), Japanese maps from the Tokugawa period, etc. She returned to EAL in May 2015 in a six-month position to catalog special Japanese materials including a collection of military maps (also funded by the Tateuchi Foundation).

Saeko has a Masters of Library Science degree from Southern Connecticut State University, a Graduate Diploma of Advanced Study in Information Studies (focusing on Archives and Records Management) from the University of Toronto, and an M.A. in Japanese Literature and Culture from the University of British Columbia. She started as a cataloger and reference librarian in the Japan Maritime Research Institute in Tokyo, Japan in the 1980s, and

Between 2004 and 2009, she worked as the Database Content Analyst and Indexer with Greenwood Publishing Group in Westport, Connecticut. Since 2014 she has been a research/teaching assistant at the University of British Columbia, teaching Japanese language and culture.
